Understanding Holy Communion

- 1. You must be in communion with Jesus Christ by faith and repentance, trusting Him alone for your salvation.

- 2. You must be in communion with your brothers and sisters in Christ. *Matthew 5:23-24; Ephesians 4:11-12*
- 3. You must be in communion with the church (any Biblebelieving church) as a baptized member in good standing.

 Matthew 18:15-18; Hebrews 13:17
- 4. Because we seriously heed Scripture's admonition in 1 Corinthians 11:28-29, We invite children who are ready to make a public profession of saving faith to complete the Communicants Class materials available at the book table, arrange a meeting with the elders, and thus become regular "communicants" at the Lord's Table.



Our Fiscal Year began June 1, 2020. Through the first four months of the new fiscal year we have a loss of -\$51,572 compared to last year's loss of -64,187. We have continued to use some of the Covid-19 Relief funds for needs with a balance remaining of \$30,349. As of October 31, we have \$144,118 cash on hand after liabilities. Thank you for your faithful giving in these difficult times.
