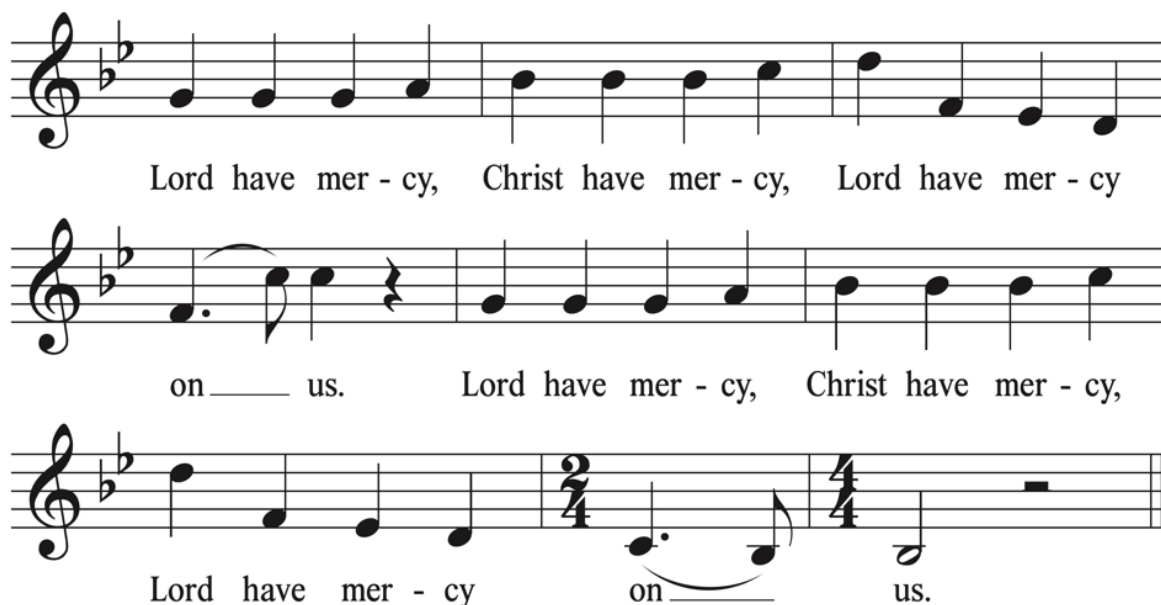

Understanding Holy Communion

3. You must be in communion with the church (any Bible-believing church) as a baptized member in good standing.
– *Matthew 18:15-18; Hebrews 13:17*
4. Because we seriously heed Scripture's admonition in 1 Corinthians 11:28-29, we invite children who are ready to make a public profession of saving faith to complete the Communicants Class materials available at the book table, arrange a meeting with the elders, and thus become regular “communicants” at the Lord’s Table. 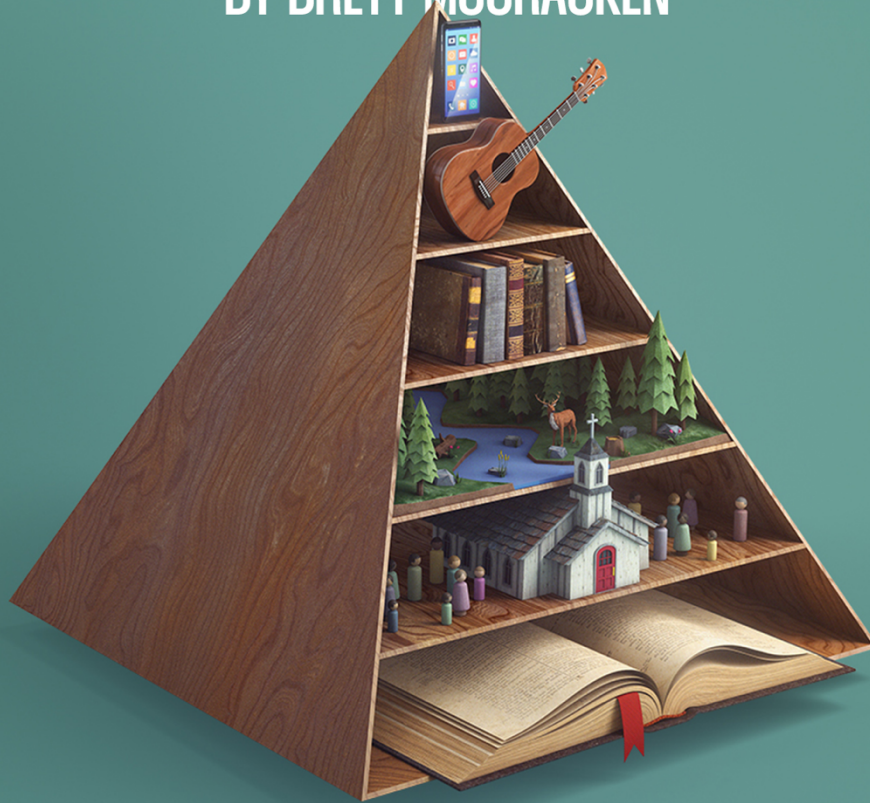

Our Fiscal Year began June 1. Through the first eleven months of our fiscal year, our giving is \$668 more than our expenses. That is \$102,233 less than last year. As of April 30, we have \$267,998 cash on hand after liabilities.
