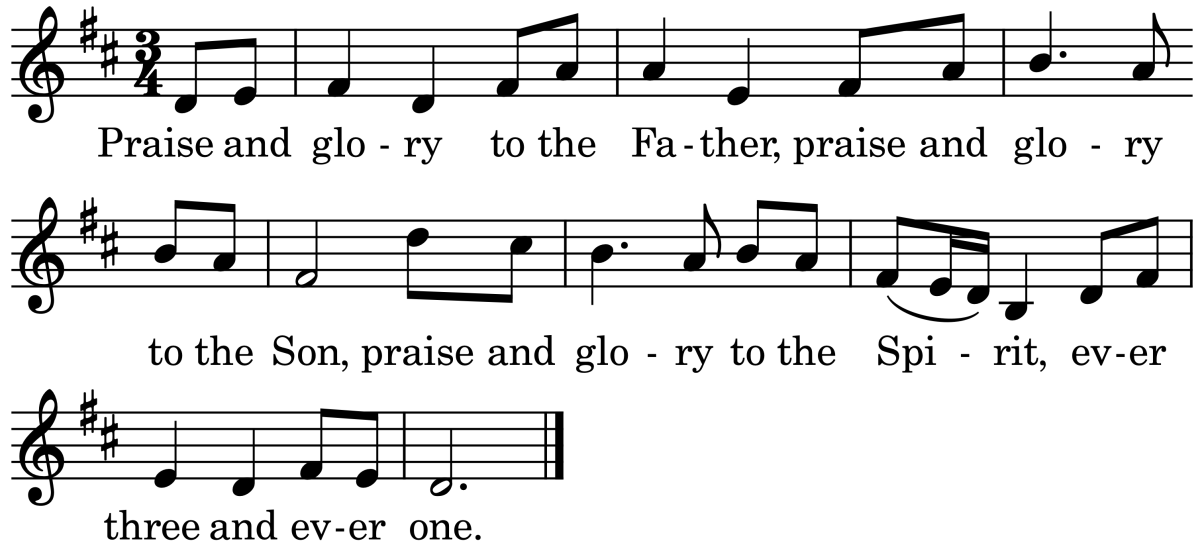

LISTENING TO GOD'S WORD

*God speaks to us from the Scriptures in the power of
the Holy Spirit to show us Jesus that we might
respond to Him in faith, repentance, and obedience.*

The Reading of the Word

Ecclesiastes 9:13-10:20

13) This is what I also observed about wisdom under the sun, and it is a great burden to me:

14) There was once a small city with a few men in it, and a great king attacked it, surrounding the city and building strong siege works against it.

15) But there was found in the city a poor wise man, and he could have delivered the city by his wisdom. Yet, no one remembered that poor man.

16) So I said, "Wisdom is better than might, but the wisdom of the poor man is despised, and his words are never listened to."

17) The words of the wise are heard in quiet are better than the shouting of a ruler among fools.

18) Wisdom is better than weapons of war, but one sinner can destroy much that is good.

1) One dead fly makes the perfumer's oil give off a rancid stench, so a little folly outweighs wisdom and honor.

2) A wise man's heart inclines him to the right, protecting him, but a fool's heart to the left, leaving him vulnerable.

3) Even when a fool walks along the road, he lacks sense and shows everyone what a fool he is.

4) If the anger of a ruler flares up against you, do not resign from your position, for calmness can undo great offenses.

5) There is an evil I have seen under the sun, like an error which goes forth from a ruler:

6) Fools are placed in many positions of authority, while wealthy men sit in lowly positions.

7) I have seen servants on horseback, and princes walking on the land like servants.

8) One who digs a pit may fall into it, and one who breaks through a wall may be bitten by a snake.

- 9) One who quarries stones may be injured by them; one who splits logs may be endangered by them.
- 10) If the ax is dull, and a workman does not sharpen its edge, he then must exert more strength, but wisdom has the advantage of giving success.
- 11) If the snake should bite before it is charmed, there is no profit for the snake charmer.
- 12) The words of a wise man's mouth are gracious, while the lips of a fool consume him.
- 13) At the beginning, his words are foolish, and at the end, his talk is evil madness.
- 14) Yet the fool multiplies words. No one knows what will happen. And who can tell him what will come after him?
- 15) The toil of a fool wearies him, so that he does not even know the way to the city.
- 16) Woe to you, O land, when your king is childish, and your princes feast in the morning.
- 17) Blessed are you, O land, when your king is the son of nobility, and your princes feast at the proper time --- for nourishment and not for drunkenness.
- 18) Because of laziness, the roof caves in, and because of idle hands, the house leaks.
- 19) Feasts are made for laughter, and wine makes life merry, and (they think that) money answers everything.
- 20) Even in your thoughts, do not curse a king, nor in your bedroom curse the rich, for a bird might report what you are thinking, or some winged creature might repeat your words.

LISTENING TO THE SHEPHERD'S GENTLE VOICE OF WISDOM

God's wisdom is always available but often neglected. (9:18-10:3)

God's wisdom entails service but not always position. (10:4-7)

God's wisdom brings success but proceeds with caution. (10:8-11)

God's wisdom expresses grace and kindness with discretion. (10:12-15)

God's wisdom advocates mature leadership that avoids passivity, self-focus, and suppression. (10:16-20)

Discussion Questions:

1. If in Psalm 6:1-7, tears are "liquid prayers," then how do you interpret Jesus' tears in Luke 19: 41 when He saw the city of Jerusalem and wept?
2. Why is God's wisdom so frequently neglected?
3. What are some ways people in our church serve well but often without recognition and position?
4. What are some ways to do a job with caution to avoid accidents and mistakes?
5. Give some examples of when Jesus practiced discretion? How do these examples teach us to be wise before God?

Pastor: The holy gifts of God for the holy people of God. Take them in remembrance that Christ died for you and feed on Him in your hearts by faith and with thanksgiving. Let us now partake of the feast!

Coming to the Table

Communion, also known as the Lord's Supper or the Eucharist, is a family meal. Therefore, all baptized Christians who trust in Jesus are invited. This is not a meal for people who have it all together but for those who belong to Him who has promised to put them back together in His grace. This is a meal for those who know they need Jesus and desire to follow Him however imperfectly. This morning, we will come forward for communion to be served by the elders of our church. As you receive the meal, they will speak words of encouragement from Scripture or concerning the meaning of communion.

If you are not a Christian, or if you are not ready to share in Communion, we encourage you to pray the prayers on the following page. Seek Jesus, and if you have any questions about the gospel, please seek out one of the pastors or elders of our church.

Children who have been baptized and whose profession of faith has been accepted by the Session of this church or the leadership of another church are welcome to participate in this meal. We invite parents of children who are ready to make a public profession of faith in Christ to complete the Communicants Handbook, available on the book table, and arrange a meeting with the elders so as to become “communing members” of this church.

Communion Bread

Gluten free bread is available in a separate pouch. Inform the elders if you need it.

Communion Wine

Wine is in the clear cups, and non-alcoholic grape juice is in the purple cups.

Prayers for Those Not Communing

For those searching for truth: Lord Jesus, You claim to be the way, the truth and the life. If what You claim is true, please guide me, teach me, and open to me the reality of who You are. Give me the ability to follow You no matter what it might cost me. Give me an understanding of You that is coherent, convincing, and leads to the life that You promise. Amen.

For those who desire to profess faith in Christ: Lord Jesus, I admit that I am weaker and more sinful than I ever believed, but through You, I am more loved and accepted than I ever dared hope. I thank You for paying my debt, bearing my punishment on the cross and offering forgiveness and new life. Knowing that You have been raised from the dead and are now representing me at the Father's right hand in heaven, I turn from my sins and receive you as my savior. Amen.

A prayer for those struggling against sin: Lord Jesus, give me the ability to see in You the fulfillment of all my needs and desires, and help me to turn from every false source of satisfaction to feed on You, the true and living bread. Enable me to lay aside the sin that clings so closely to me, and run with perseverance the race that You have set before me, looking only to You, the author and perfecter of my faith. Amen.

A prayer for covenant children who have not yet made a profession of faith: Lord Jesus, thank You for giving me the opportunity to grow up in a Christian family where I am surrounded by the good news of the gospel. Help me to grow in my understanding of who you are and what you have done for me on the cross. Help me learn what it means for me to turn from my sins and trust in you alone for my salvation. Teach me what it means to follow You as one of Your disciples. Amen.

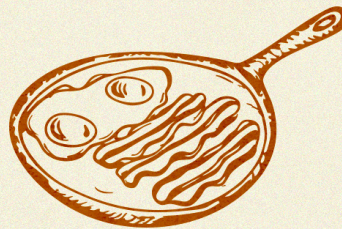

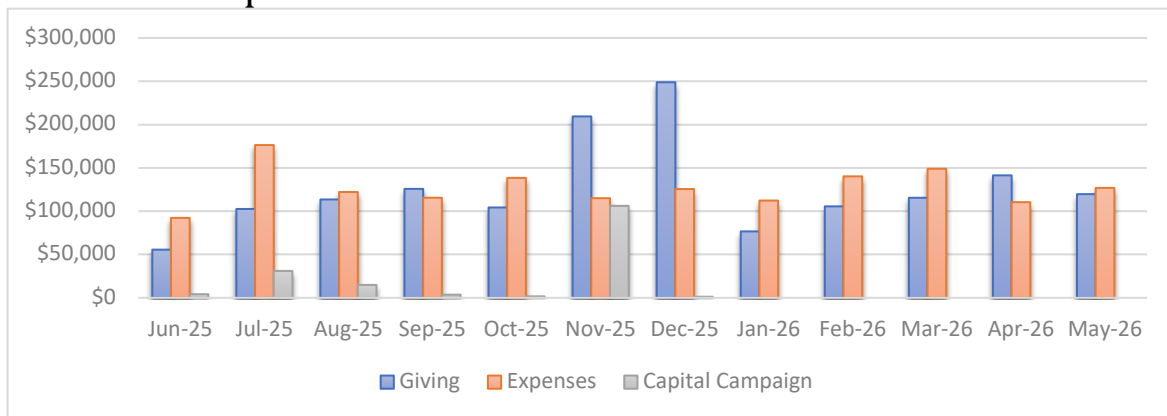
Full Results from Fiscal Year 2026 (Revised)
